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<u>June Tayler</u> 1 June 1947 - 11 January 2023

It is with sadness that we learned of the passing into the spiritual world of our friend June Tayler last month. Though June and Allan moved their family to Ingleburn, NSW many years ago, they still considered Roseville their church. A service for June was held on 24 January in Leppington, NSW.

Minister's Address delivered at June's service by Rev. Howard A. Thompson



Charles Horton Cooley, an early 20th century American sociologist, said: "I am not who you think I am; I am not who I think I am; I am who I think you think I am."

There is an important relationship lesson in that statement (and I'll let you ponder that on your own), but there is also an important lesson to be learned about why we are here. We certainly are not here for June... She is now in far more capable

hands than ours...and there is no

magic series of words I can say or gestures I can make with my hands to ease her journey in the next life. We are not even really here for us...saying goodbye to a loved one is never easy, or pleasurable, but the time to say goodbye is certainly not after they are gone....Who are we here for? We are here for the June that lives in our hearts; the June we want to remember. More than remember, actually; The June we want to guide our thinking, our intentions and our actions in the future. In short, the June we want to carry with us forever.

Born in England in 1947, June was born into a world grappling with the aftermath of a devastating World War. The eldest of four children June's full name was June Hartley (no middle-name), the family joke goes that they were too poor to give their children middle names. What the family lacked in material wealth, however, they more than made up for in Spiritual wealth.

The Lord says:

"Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be." (Matthew 6:19-21)

Of course the desires of June's heart were not limited to Spiritual matters, but they certainly seem to be physical expressions of those spiritual treasures.

- June loves to travel, a love that seemed to express her love of the Lord's creation and a love of the neighbour. A love which brought June to Australia where she met a fellow British expat, Allan Tayler.
- June loves nursing June's love of nursing was certainly a love of serving others no one goes into nursing for the money, if they do, I suspect they don't last long.
- June loves her charities; Zonta International and Girl Guides. Both charities June was involved in were focused on empowering women both locally and internationally.
- June loves her family Wife, Mother and Grandmother to Zackary Amelia Finnegan Edie. June, you will hear later, was the mortar that held the family together.

June's life spanned a period in human history of extraordinary technological and medical advancement, of unprecedented political and cultural change and a period of unprecedented improvements in quality of life. All these advances, particularly those technological and cultural, seem to have happened concurrently with an equally dramatic collapse in formal faith practices, particularly in western societies.

June's faith practice certainly never collapsed. Raised in a strong New Church tradition, June made the New Church her own as an adult. Upon her arrival in Australia she made certain to connect with the New Church Society in Sydney. Good thing she did, because that is where she met a fellow British expat named Allan. And, from my understanding, it didn't take long and marriage was in the offing. Though demands of her nursing career and distance from the nearest New Church congregation made it difficult to attend church frequently June still found a way to make faith a part of her's, Allan's, their children's and their grandchildren's lives. Of course, attending church regularly is a useful and good thing to do, but more important is taking what you learn from your faith and making that a part of your life and who you are.

A New Church minister and long-time friend of June's said this; "As a person there was absolutely nothing superficial about June. She didn't try to be who she wasn't. She was very content with who she knew herself to be. June was unfailingly pleasant, thoughtful of others, somewhat shy...but a good conversationalist, always an attentive listener, and never raised her voice....I personally came to regard June as one of life's "golden souls"; a person whose presence, contribution and sphere lifts the spirit of people who know them and walk life's journey with them. A "Golden Soul"...I think June certainly succeeded in making the teachings of her faith part of who she was.

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In my role I have been with many people in the last days and sometimes moments of their physical lives. June had an aura of peace around her that is rare...and it brings to mind a favorite passage of hers:

Arcana Coelestia/Secrets of Heaven 4855

Peace holds within itself trust in the Lord, the trust that He governs all things and provides all things, and that He leads towards an end that is good. When a person believes these things about the Lord they are at peace, since they fear nothing and no anxiety about things to come disturbs them. How far a person attains this state depends on how far they attain love to the Lord.

The family has asked that I share some of the words they they have shared with me over the past few weeks.

Pauline wants to say that there are no words that need to be said to my mum. She knows how much love I have for her. How much I appreciated her. How much I valued her. She was my best friend...All I want to say is Thank you. Thank you for the nature, guidance and mentoring



and, most of all, thank you for Family. You are at the core of our family. You loved and cared for all of us. You have shaped each of us and become a part of us and we will hold you in our hearts for the rest of our lives.

Philip says - Mum, I respect you as a quiet teacher and leader. You positively changed the lives of many in practical, unassuming and empowering ways.... Through the way you lived your life and until the end, you taught me selflessness, kindness and putting other people first.... Your care and love for others has always quietly shone and without me knowing, it has shaped my values and what I contribute to the world.

From the words shared with me by Philip and Pauline, one word comes to mind; "Matriarch." There are a lot of mothers and grandmothers in this world, many of them very special to their children and grandchildren, but there are very few deserving of the title "Matriarch." If you've had one, you know it and you have been well blessed.

Tuesdays have regularly become our most social open days of the week. 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Inaugural Easter Readings

Since arriving in Roseville in 2018 I have endeavoured to share with you the annual Christmas Readings produced by my colleague Rev. Mark Pendleton, Pastor of the Glenview New Church. Over the years I have enjoyed these Readings and appreciated the help they have given me in experiencing the Christmas Season on a deeper level. I have often thought similar readings could be produced around the Easter Story. Well, I am excited to share with you that our friends in

the General Church (based in Bryn Athyn, PA, USA) have developed a 6 week series of daily readings around the Easter Story.

Like the Christmas Readings, these readings are intended as an aid to your personal reflection on the story of the Lord's life, death, and resurrection. Each daily reading features a scriptural passage from the Easter story and commentary from New Church teachings, followed by some reflections and a question to consider. Readings will begin February 22nd and extend through Easter Sunday.


Interested in group discussions about the Easter Readings? You can also join an online discussion group which will meet weekly during the Easter Season.


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2023 Sermon Series THE PATH OF INTEGRITY
